## <u>The Declaration of Independence and Autonomy from the United States of</u> <u>America</u>



hen the event of a political disagreement between two human groups of different kinds are one nation, it is better to separate the nation than to keep it together and, if the nation is kept together, the result is war. A war would be a loss for both Governments, and as a result, the Federated States of Gapla does not want it to happen. I remind the Government of the United States of America

again: The Government of the Federated States of Gapla and the government of its states do not want to go to war with the United States of America, but rather, a peaceful and truly unfortunate separation of the two countries has occurred in the course of human history. It has been refused by human nature to let the two groups, now countries, continue as one.

The rights of the Federated States of Gapla shall be equal as any other foreign state of the same size including, but not limited to, rights to create laws, taxes, government systems, declaration of war, allies, unions, military, and financial system inside our territory. In every way, the Federated States of Gapla will be free from the rule of the Government of the United States of America.

Please note that the right to later form an alliance with the United States of America is entirely legal, as the Federated States of Gapla shall be treated as a foreign state in every way, and therefore shall be able to make its own decisions by its government. These decisions shall not be forced, influenced, or blocked by the Government of the United States of America, unless when the United States of America has the proper authority to do so. We are not committing treason against the United States Government, as this is a declaration allowed by International Law. We, therefore, the Representatives of the Federated States of Gapla, in Parliament of our Government, appealing to the Supreme Judge of the Federated States of Gapla the rectitude of our intentions, do, in the name, and by the authority of the Government of the Federated States if Gapla, that the Federated States of Gapla ought to be Free and Independent States and Territories and that they are all absolved from all Allegiance to the United States of America, and that all political connection between the Federated States of Gapla and the United States of America is and ought to be completely dissolved.
